Communication

Our summer office hours are 9am to 12pm, Monday through Friday. Beginning August 12th, we resume regular office hours: 8am to 4pm, Monday through Friday. **Please call the High School office at 734-9481, if you have any questions.**

Class Dues: All high school students are required to pay class dues of \$75.00 by August 13th. Checks ONLY, no cash. These dues go towards all school-sponsored dances, homecoming activities, Senior Trip and Senior Prom. (Class dues are separate from any other monies owed to the school.)

Student Parking Placards: Parking placards are required for all students who drive to school. The placards are **free** and can be picked up in the High School office. Students must complete the 2019-20 Vehicle Registration Form before a placard will be issued.

Driver's Education: Information will be sent out in the Fall regarding dates, time, and sign-ups for Driver's Education.

Attention Students and Parents of the class of 2023

Students, you are invited to participate in a freshman orientation on Monday, August 12 from 4:00-8:00PM. Here's what you need to know:

1. Wear regular school attire to school activities. This is your first chance to show us that you understand the Student Dress Code (pg 22). There will be time to change into your swim gear at the lake.
2. For our time at the lake please bring a swimming suit, a towel, and a t-shirt or cover up.
3. Girls, a one piece bathing suit is preferred. However, if you don't have one you can wear a colored shirt (not white) over your suit while in the water.
4. All students will be required to wear a shirt or cover-up when not in the water.

Parents, come a little early to pick up your students from their night at the lake. At 7pm, there will be an informal time of getting to know each other, asking questions, and praying for your children. As a bonus, 9th grade Chromebooks will be available for pick up at this time.

MIDDLE SCHOOL

Student Schedules: **7th graders** will pick up their schedules at the **7th Grade Welcome Party** on Monday, August 12. Further information will be coming later. **8th graders** will get their schedules on the first day of school.

Lockers: Lockers will be available for all 7th and 8th graders. Only CVC issued locks are to be used. Lockers must be kept locked at all times students are in class and after school to prevent any loss/theft. We are a Christian school but temptations are real. There is a designated spot in each homeroom for oversized items (sports bags, instruments, etc.).

Immunizations: **ALL** incoming 7th graders and all new students will need a TDAP booster and a second varicella (chicken pox) immunization before school begins. Verification of these immunizations must be provided to the middle school office before the first day of school.

REMINDER: Pick up your FREE Public Library Card before school begins!

All 7-12th grade students need to obtain a public library card this summer so we will be ready for research when school begins. Library cards are free! Anyone under the age of 18 wishing to have a library card must be accompanied by their parents or legal guardian. Additionally, parents must fill out the application and provide a picture ID and proof of current address. Be sure to check when your library is open. Our 7th-12th grade teachers and librarian would like to help students learn valuable research skills. With a public library card you can access quality databases and use the information in all subject areas. With the use of your public library card and the internet, we can show you the importance of evaluating the information you find online.

Lunches: Middle school lunch time is from 11:25-11:55am. Hot lunch will begin on August 15. Hot lunches may be ordered online at joycatering.ahotlunch.com. The August menu will be open for ordering on August 1 for \$4.42 per lunch. If your child forgets their lunch, there is a salad bar available for \$6 (\$5 if paid within 24 hours). A new monthly menu will be open for ordering in the middle of each month for the upcoming month. You may contact Brenda Byrd at brenda.joycatering@gmail.com if you have any questions. If you would like to bring your student a "special" lunch, please make sure it is in the office before the beginning of lunch time. Early Dismissals: We realize that sometimes it is necessary to schedule appointments during the school day. However, since your student's education is important to us, we ask that these be kept to a minimum. **IF** your student does have an appointment during the school day, please **email or telephone the office first thing in the morning**, or send a note with your student to be brought into the office first thing in the morning. An early dismissal will then be given to the student informing the teacher of when the student will be leaving. Classes will be interrupted only in an emergency situation to call a student out of class. If it is not possible to notify us first thing in the morning, please let us know **at least ½ hour in advance of picking up your student**.

Middle School Sports 411: We hit the ground running when it comes to middle school sports. We begin the school year with girls' volleyball and boys' flag football. Practices will start on Monday, August 19. Practices are held on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday of each week from 3:15-5:00pm. Games are usually on Tuesdays and Thursdays, with a few Mondays thrown in. Boys' and girls' soccer will follow football and volleyball. Then we move on to basketball after Christmas break. We end the year with baseball, softball, and track in the spring. ELEMENTARY

Before and After School Care

- **Eligibility**
 - Care is available for all K-6th grade students.
- **Location**
 - Elementary Music Media Center (MMC), the building east of the elementary office
- **Before Care** begins on Thursday, August 15
 - Hours: 7:30-7:55am (excluding school vacations and holidays)
 - Cost: \$2/child/day or \$120/child/semester
- **After Care** begins on Thursday, August 15
 - Hours: 3:00-5:30pm (excluding ½ days, school vacations, and holidays)
 - Cost: \$8/child/day or \$500/child/semester
- **Registration:** Online registration will launch in August after class lists have been sent.
 - Each child will need to be registered individually.
 - Each household wanting care must register the child(ren) to allow for separate billing.
 - Registration is available throughout the year, but must be completed by 12:00pm the day a student will need care.
- **Billing** will be due by month or by semester, depending upon a family's choice to use the daily or the semester rate. Billing will be managed through FACTS, the same portal families use to manage and pay tuition.
- **Additional information** will be given to a family once they register their child(ren) for Care.

School Lunches

Hot lunch begins on August 15. Hot lunches may be ordered online at joycatering.ahotlunch.com.

Every family that wants to order hot lunch will need to add their child and enter them into the appropriate grade level.

The August menu will be open for ordering on August 1 at the following price levels: K=\$3.92, 1st-3rd=\$4.17, 4th-6th=\$4.42. Portions increase at the noted grade levels. Emergency lunches will be available for \$6 (\$5 if paid within 24 hours.) An emergency lunch consists of: a microwave lunch entree, fruit, and a cookie. If you would like to bring your student a "special" lunch, it must be in the office BEFORE the beginning of lunch time; otherwise an Emergency Lunch will be given to them.

Reminder: Tuition payments are **due the 1st of each month**. FACTS will send a reminder email by the 15th of each month, prior to the payment date. A late fee of 1.5% of the balanced owed, will be charged monthly.

Any parent who withdraws their student during the school year, will be charged tuition to the completion of the quarter in which the student is withdrawn, beginning July 1, 2019. This policy will apply to all situations except those in which the withdrawal is due to a move out of the area, or in which your child(ren) has been asked by the School Board to leave the school.
